The aims of the PINECL project are:

- to develop an accredited training programme that parents can use to become qualified family learning advisors
- to provide an online hub where parents can network, share their experience and support each other
- to bring parents in rural communities and social and healthcare service providers together in support of early childhood development and education

What is PINECL about?

Training

- Parents of young children from infancy up to primary school age
- Adult learners who would like to train and acquire accreditation as lay family learning advisors
- Social and healthcare workers supporting parents of young children

Welcome to the Parent's Academy, a new and vibrant social network addressing parenting and early childhood development. Currently under construction, when completed in autumn 2014, the Parent's Academy will provide training, networking and supports for parents of young children from infancy up to primary school age.

It will also provide a forum for professionals working in the field of early childhood development supporting the exchange of best practice and offering access to a wide range of resources and materials.

The PINECL project is being developed by a consortium of eight partners representing Ireland (2), Cyprus, Romania, Italy, United Kingdom, Austria and Finland with funding from the European Commission under the Lifelong Learning Programme 2007-2013.



The project consortium comprises five acting partners and three supporting partners who are combining their considerable expertise to design and develop the proposed training, support and social network frameworks. Each acting partner is working closely with a series of stakeholder focus groups to ensure that the opinions and feedback of parents, adult education providers and social and healthcare professionals are at the heart of the project's development process. The PINECL project has been funded under Key Activity 3 of the EU Lifelong Learning Programme.

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
